

**Declaration of Local State of Emergency**  
**Village of Glenview**  
**Cook County, Illinois**

I, James R. Patterson, Jr., Village President of the Village of Glenview, being first duly sworn under penalty of perjury, attest to the truthfulness of the following:

**I. Findings.**

A. The nature of the current and ongoing emergency is the global pandemic resulting from COVID-19 (*a.k.a.*, Novel Coronavirus).

B. COVID-19 is a severe respiratory illness caused by the SARS-CoV-2 virus, a new strain of coronavirus that is spread from person to person, posing a threat to the health and safety of the residents of the Village of Glenview.

C. No drug or vaccine is currently available to treat or prevent COVID-19.

D. On January 27, 2020, United States Department of Health and Human Services Secretary Alex Azar declared a national public health emergency due to COVID-19.

E. On March 9, 2020, Illinois Governor J.B. Pritzker issued a Gubernatorial Disaster Proclamation declaring that all counties in the State of Illinois, including Cook County, are disaster areas due to the Novel Coronavirus.

F. On March 11, 2020, the World Health Organization declared COVID-19 to be a global pandemic.

G. On March 13, 2020, President of the United States Donald Trump issued a declaration of a national emergency due to the growing COVID-19 crisis in the United States.

H. On March 20, 2020, Governor Pritzker issued an Executive Order requiring all non-essential persons to stay at home with limited exceptions and non-essential businesses to cease operations with limited exceptions, which order was effective March 21, 2020 through April 7, 2020, which order was recently extended to April 30, 2020.

I. On March 26, 2020, President Trump also issued a major disaster declaration for the State of Illinois due to the COVID-19 crisis.

J. The number of individuals in Illinois infected with COVID-19 continues to increase regularly, and often daily, and each day COVID-19 continues its spread constitutes a separate occurrence of this natural disaster.

K. The spread of COVID-19 is an ongoing crisis, as evidenced by increasingly stringent social distancing mandates and recommendations issued by State and Federal Authorities.

L. Preparedness, response, and recovery from the COVID-19 virus is of paramount importance and the virus has the risk of substantially endangering the health, safety, and property of the citizens of the Village of Glenview.


## II. Declaration of Emergency.

Pursuant to the authority vested in the Office of Village President by the Illinois Municipal Code (65 ILCS 5/11-1-6), the Illinois Emergency Management Agency Act (20 ILCS 3305/11), and the Municipal Code of the Village of Glenview (Sec. 26-41), I, James R. Patterson, Jr., the Village President of the Village of Glenview, do hereby declare that a current and ongoing Local State of Emergency exists as of this date, April 8, 2020, and shall continue until not later than the adjournment of the first regular meeting of the Village Board after this Local State of Emergency is declared; provided, however, that the corporate authorities, in their discretion, may extend the duration of this Declaration by a majority vote of the corporate authorities.

During the existence of the Local State of Emergency, the Village President shall execute such authority as provided under the Illinois Municipal Code, the Illinois Emergency Management Agency Act and Municipal Code of the Village of Glenview. Without limiting the foregoing grant of authority, I currently intend to exercise during the term of this Local State of Emergency only that power which is necessary to make and approve purchases and wages, to manage the assignment and allocation of personnel, equipment, and materials of the Village, to declare a force majeure concerning any collective bargaining agreements between the Village and any bargaining unit(s) representing Village employees, to take any and all actions and issue any other order as is imminently necessary for the protection of life, property, health, safety, and public welfare, and to generally enforce the guidelines, orders, and regulations issued by the United States Center for Disease Control and Prevention, the Governor of the State of Illinois, and State and local departments of public health.

This Declaration of Local State of Emergency shall be filed with the Village of Glenview Clerk as soon as practicable.

I, James R. Patterson, Jr., whose name is signed to this instrument, being first duly sworn, signed and executed the instrument as the Declaration of Local State of Emergency, and that I signed willingly, and that I executed it as my free and voluntary act for the purposes therein expressed.
