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GLENVIEW-NORTHBROOK CORONAVIRUS TASK FORCE STATEMENT: OUR SCHOOLS SOON IN SESSION

August 14, 2020 – Over the next two weeks, students in our community will return to school. Some schools will start the school year in a remote environment, phasing into in-person teaching and learning; others will open their buildings for students and staff to return to some level of in-person instruction right away, while continuing the option for remote learning.

In all cases, superintendents and other school district leaders have been working tirelessly in an ever-changing landscape to make the decisions they believe are best for their districts -- knowing that every decision imposes challenges to students, staff, families and the community as a whole. The leaders have collaborated together along with other civic and health leaders to understand the COVID-19 status regionally and locally. As a group they have set the framework to be safe, flexible and responsive and continue to keep the lines of communication open.

Support for Remote and Hybrid Learning

The park districts and public libraries in Glenview and Northbrook are providing support and resources for students and families who are facing a different start and different schedules for the new school year:

Glenview Public Library: From self-guided early literacy programs to virtual volunteer opportunities and homework help, the Glenview Public Library has a variety of programs and resources to support remote learning for kids of all ages.

- **Storytime on Demand:** Youth Services librarians have compiled books available online with songs, rhymes, and activities for your family to do at home as a storytime-on-demand. Virtual kits are released once a week online, and previous kits are available at glenviewpl.org/kids/storytime.
- **1000 Books Before Kindergarten:** Give your child a head start in school with 1000 Books Before Kindergarten, a self-guided early literacy program, open to children with a Glenview Public Library card, or attend a Glenview school or preschool. Learn more at glenviewpl.org/1000books.
- **Books & Badges:** Children read at home and earn badges to sew on a backpack, jacket, library bag, or cap. The program is open to children age 4-

grade 8 with a Glenview Public Library card or who attend a Glenview school. Visit glenviewpl.org/kids/books-badges/ for more information.

- **Virtual Volunteers:** 7th-12th graders can earn service credit while giving back to the community! A variety of volunteer activities are available, including creating trivia sheets, decorating sidewalks around Youth Services of Glenview/Northbrook, participating in a citizen science campaign, and more. All activities can be completed at home, online, or outdoors. Visit glenviewpl.org/kids/volunteering/ for more details about the program and how to participate.
- **Homework Help:** Find online homework help and resources at glenviewpl.org/kids/homework-help. Select a database by a subject category listed below, then enter your Glenview Library card number as prompted.

Northbrook Public Library: You can use your library card to access online resources for students of all ages, including real-time expert assistance from certified Brainfuse tutors, and guided help with test prep and practice tests for ACT/SAT, AP, and more. [Need a library card?](#)

- **Online Resources for Students:** Our [Homework help](#) resources include online tutoring, writing guidance, test prep, and more. Other [online resources](#) for students include eBooks, digital magazines, and newspapers from around the world.
- **Library Programs:** We have virtual programs for students of all ages, including Storytime, Books & Bytes, and [Teen Advisory Board](#), which gives students a chance to earn service hours. See all of our upcoming [youth programs](#).
- **Research or Tech Help:** [Get help](#) with research or accessing our online resources. Or sign up for one of our weekly online [Tech Tuesday](#) programs held each Tuesday from 3-5pm.
- **Book Bags for Teachers (and parents):** Our [Teacher Book Bag](#) service lets teachers request book bags based on subjects being taught in their classes. This service is also available to Northbrook library cardholders who are homeschooling or looking to extend learning for children at home.

Glenview Park District: Camp REC is a new program for children K-8 offering a convenient, self-directed eLearning opportunity. Children will be assigned to pods of 15 participants or less in a format that meets all health and safety guidelines. Camp REC will provide a structured schedule 5 days a week that alternates designated time for self-directed eLearning and recreational activities including indoor/outdoor games, arts and crafts, sports, drama, and dancing. Camp REC leaders will coordinate the day's activities around eLearning schedules. Hurry and register for the lottery this weekend! The lottery will close on Sunday at 11:59 p.m. and enrolled registrants will be notified with details no later than Friday, August 21. [Learn More.](#)

Northbrook Park District: Community TIES (Together in Educational Support) has been formed to meet the community's need for support for families who have alternative learning schedules. Children will have the opportunity to engage in virtual learning with adult supervision and assistance as needed.
