VILLAGE MANAGER HILEMAN TO LEAVE AFTER 12 YEARS

November 22, 2016 – Todd Hileman, Glenview’s Village Manager since December 2004, has resigned to become City Manager of Denton, Texas. Hileman submitted his resignation to the Village Board of Trustees effective January 31, 2017.

“It has been a privilege and an honor serving both the Village Board of Trustees and residents of Glenview for the past 12 years,” Hileman said. “I have had an opportunity to work with a tremendously dedicated and competent staff that makes us proud every day.”

During his tenure, Hileman streamlined the delivery of Village services through innovative management by incorporating accountability, customer focus, efficiency, and transparency – all while guarding and improving Glenview’s finances.

“Glenview has been fortunate to have had Todd’s skillset and continuous improvement results all these years,” Glenview Village President Jim Patterson said. “We wish him the very best in his future endeavors.”

Hileman championed numerous projects that will have long-term benefits for the community, including the ongoing revitalization of the downtown business district; retail and residential developments on the southeast and northwest corners of the Village; and a consolidated, centralized municipal center.

As important were the improvements made internally in Village government in customer service, business processes, and organizational analyses. Through Hileman’s leadership, Glenview has continually and proactively taken steps to keep finances healthy, by annually adopting a sustainable Village budget and incorporating cost-containment measures.

He was instrumental in the formation of the Municipal Partnership Initiative, a consortium of 25 municipalities in north Cook and Lake Counties that since 2010 have jointly bid infrastructure and capital works projects, thereby obtaining economies of scale and other efficiencies.

As a representative of the consortium, Glenview in 2012 was recognized with an Outstanding Achievement in Local Government Innovation Award from the Alliance for Innovation and the Community Partnership Program Excellence Award by the International City/County Management Association. His work with the Municipal Partnership Initiative also earned him the 2015 Local Transformer Award from Transform Illinois.

The Village Board of Trustees will launch a search for a new Village Manager. Deputy Village Manager Don Owen will assume the role of Interim Village Manager.

Hileman began his career in public service as an administrative intern with the Village of Niles and served as Assistant to the Village Administrator in Cary. He was Administrator of Vandalia, Mo., and Delavan, Wis., and Assistant City Manager and City Manager of Avondale, Ariz. Hileman received his bachelor's degree from Arizona State University and a master's degree from Northern Illinois University.
