

PERMIT FOR WRECKING OR DEMOLITION

Before proceeding with the wrecking or tearing down of any building or other structure more than one story in height or of any structure of greater than 750 square feet, a permit for such wrecking or tearing down shall first be obtained by the owner or his agent from the Building and Zoning Director; provided that all the work done hereunder shall be subject to the supervision of the Building Official and to such reasonable restrictions as he may impose in regard to elements of safety and health, and further, that sufficient scaffolding be provided to insure safety to human life. In the case of masonry buildings, the work shall be kept sprinkled to minimize dust.

- A. Before any permit is issued granting authority to wreck a building or structure for which such permit is required, the person, firm, or corporation engaged in the work of wrecking shall file with the Building Department a bond in the penal sum of \$25,000 with the sureties to be approved by the Building and Zoning Director, to guarantee payment in full to the Village and to duly franchised utility companies entitled to a use of public property, for any and all damage inflicted on public property by reason of the pursuance of a wrecking operation. Any costs incurred by the Village for any actions necessitated by the failure of the wrecking contractor to protect persons, property, or things on the site of, adjacent to, or in connection with the wrecking operation shall also be recoverable from the aforementioned \$25,000 bond.
- B. Before any permit is issued granting authority to wreck a building or structure for which such permit is required, the person, firm, or corporation engaged in the work of wrecking shall file with the Building Department a certificate of insurance certifying that the applicant is insured for Workmen's Compensation and Occupational Disease Liability under the Illinois Act and Comprehensive General and Automobile Liability with the limit of at least \$50,000 per accident Bodily Injury and Property Damage to indemnify the Village of Glenview, Illinois, against any loss, cost, damage, expense, judgment, or liability of any kind whatsoever which the Village may suffer, or Village of any of its officials from or by reason or on account of accidents to persons or property during any such wrecking operations, and from or by reason or on account of anything done under or by virtue of any permit granted for any such wrecking operations.
- C. A completed demolition permit application is required with permit submission. Four (4) copies of the site plan must be submitted showing how the site will be restored and the soil stabilized. (See Article 12C of the Glenview Zoning Ordinance for a detailed explanation of requirements.) Four (4) copies of the Plat of Survey showing the location of the building to be removed shall be submitted with the permit application.

All materials and spoil relative to the wrecking of a structure shall be removed from the site. Underground tanks must be pumped dry and removed.

PERMIT FOR WRECKING OR DEMOLITION - CONTINUED

- D. A street opening escrow must be applied for and issued before digging or disconnection of services in the right-of-way.
- E. J.U.L.I.E. (Joint Utility Locating Information for Excavators: Call toll free 1-800-892-0123) and the Village of Glenview Engineering Department shall be notified for location and disconnection of utilities.
- F. Existing electrical services shall be disconnected by the utility company providing the service.
- G. Existing wells on site shall be capped by a State of Illinois Certified Well Driller to seal wells as per State of Illinois Specifications. A copy of the signed and sealed affidavit shall be submitted to both the Village of Glenview Health Department and Building Department.
- H. Existing septic tanks shall be removed and the excavated area filled with sand or gravel and compacted. Location of fields shall be located on the Plat of Survey. (See Item "C" above).
- I. Gas services shall be disconnected by the utility company providing the service.
- J. Existing Village water services shall be disconnected at the corporation on the main prior to issuance of permit; proof of inspection required. Contact engineering department for inspection.
- K. Existing Village sewer services shall be capped at the sewer main prior to issuance of permit; proof of inspection required. Contact engineering department for inspection.
- L. The fee to be charged for permits to wreck a building or structure shall be \$10.00 plus \$.50 per 1,000 cubic feet of the contents of the building or structure. The cubic contents shall be obtained by multiplying the ground area by the height measured from the underside lowest floor to the highest point of the main roof.

The price for street opening escrows shall be assessed by the Village of Glenview Engineering Department.

- M. All excavations from basements, crawl spaces, and tank removals must be filled and compacted. A soil Engineer's report shall be submitted indicating lifts and results of compaction testing.
- N. Approved site plan review and/or a single-family residence permit must be obtained before any demolition permits will be issued.

SITE DEVELOPMENT PERMITS

Site development permits shall be required for all work involving new construction or additions to existing structures including detached garages and large accessory or commercial buildings and will be issued prior to a building or demolition permit except the following permits: sheds, decks, driveways, patios, sidewalks, fences, siding, interior remodeling, plumbing, electrical or similar permits involving little or no site work. A supervisor shall be consulted if there is any question as to whether a permit is required.

A site development inspection shall be approved prior to the issuance of a building or demolition permit.

The following requirements shall be met:

- Location of 6'-0" chain link fence around perimeter of site, disturbed areas, excavation or stockpiles.
- Silt fencing trenched 6" around perimeter of site, disturbed areas, excavations or stockpiles.
- All trees shall be protected prior to construction, including parkway trees.
- Contractor sign shall be provided.
- A No Trespassing sign shall be posted.
- A stone haul road shall be used for entry and exit into the site.
- A Demolition/New Construction sign should be posted for all demolitions or new construction projects.

TO ALL DEVELOPERS

This document is intended to inform you of your responsibilities during the development process. When you commence the process on a parcel of property in the Village of Glenview, whether it has an existing structure on it or if it is a vacant parcel, you must maintain the property both during the planning and design process as well as during construction.

Specifically;

- The grass and weeds must be maintained below eight (8) inches tall. If any dumping of debris, landscape waste, etc. occurs, it must be cleaned up promptly.
- If a structure exists on the property, it must be kept in a safe and structurally sound condition.
- The structure must be secured to prevent entry into the building by unauthorized persons.
- Any new or existing foundation must be kept dry. Any standing water must be pumped out.

If the Public Health Department receives any complaints on the property prior to construction, you will be notified of confirmed violations and instructed as to the time frame in which you must correct the violations. If you do not correct the violations within the prescribed time, the Public Health Administrator will notify the other Departments involved in your development and recommend that you not be allowed on the agenda for any Commissions (Plan Commission, Zoning Board, Appearance Commission, Board of Trustees). Citations with court appearance required may also be issued to you for failure to maintain your property.

The same rules apply during construction. The property must be maintained. If violations occur and are not corrected, we will notify the Building Department and recommend a "stop work order" be issued on the project.

Procedures for Demolition Permit Application only:

An Application shall be completely and accurately filled out and submitted to the Department of Environmental Control. The following three items must accompany this application at the time of submittal:

1. A fee in compliance with Article X of the Cook County Environmental Control Ordinance.

2. A hand drawn site plan (A plat of survey would suffice), and

3. An Asbestos assessment report, by an IDPH licensed inspector.

Procedures for Asbestos Removal Permit Application only:

An application shall be completely and accurately filled out and submitted to the Department of Environmental Control. A fee in compliance with Article X of the Cook County Environmental Control Ordinance must accompany this application at the time of submittal.

This Permit will be subject to the following conditions:

(1) If the structure is located in an incorporated village, town or city in Cook County, all local requirements/permits applicable to demolition renovation of structure must be satisfied.

(2) If the structure is located in unincorporated Cook County, a permit from the Cook County Department of Building and Zoning (Suite 2830, 69 W. Washington, Chicago, IL 60602, (312)603-0500, must be obtained.

(3) The Provisions of The Cook County Environmental Control Ordinance apply.

(4) The SPECIAL CONDTIONS on the reverse of this form must be followed.

(5) No facsimiles of the original will be accepted and all applications must be mailed or hand carried to this Department. The permit is valid for no more than (30) thirty days. Any changes in the starting and/or completion dates of the demolition removal schedule, must be submitted to the Department 48 hours prior to the actual demolition.

(6) If the demolition completion date expires without notification to the Department and the actual work has not been completed, a new permit must be obtained.

(7) In emergency situations, this Department must be notified immediately of the circumstances and a follow up letter sent explaining the details.

If any of the above conditions are not followed, the Demolition Permit will be <u>VOIDED</u> and enforcement measures initiated. If you have any questions concerning any of the above provisions, please contact Rudolph Trejo at (312) 603-8200.

SPECIAL CONDTIONS

DEMOLITION - DISMANTLEMENT - ALTERATIONS - RAZING

<u>Toppling of Walls</u>: When demolition by toppling occurs such reasonable measures for dust emission control as it is compatible with the type and structure shall be utilized. Before the demolition or toppling of any section or wall of structure, adequate wetling to suppress the dust shall be employed.

<u>Wetting Procedures</u>: Before the demolition of any section of wall, floor, roof, or other structure, adequate wetting procedures to lay the dust shall be utilized. All debris shall be thoroughly wetted before loading and while dumping into trucks, other vehicles or containers. In all cases at all stages of demolition, wetting procedures shall be adequate to lay the dust.

Transport of Debris: Trucks shall be adequately covered or enclosed to prevent dust dispersion while in transit to point of disposal.

<u>Structural Supports - Steel and Wood Beams - Thrusts</u>: No structural members shall be dropped or thrown from any floor but shall be carefully lowered to ground level by hoists.

<u>Handling Procedures – Debris</u>: Debris shall not be dropped or thrown from any floor to any floor below. In buildings six stories or greater in height, debris shall be transported from the upper floors via enclosed dust-tight chutes or via buckets. Where chutes are used, a water wetting agent spray shall be employed to saturate the debris before it reaches the point of discharge from the chute.

<u>Demolition Precautions</u>: Water spray fogging nozzles shall be employed within chute to effect entrainment of particulate matter when feasible. Where buckets are used, the debris shall be adequately wetted to preclude dust dispersion when buckets are dumped. In the event particulate matter becomes airborne for a continuous period of ten minutes, despite the application of the above procedures or due to freezing temperatures, preclude the use of water for laying the demolition dust, the work of demolition shall cease at once until other adequate measures can be taken.

<u>Asbestos</u>: Where there is asbestos containing material present, the demolition and renovation activity shall be conducted in compliance with Article X of the Cook County Environmental Ordinance, 40 CFR Part 61, Subpart M and any other applicable laws.

<u>Demolition Excess Debris</u>: No excess materials and debris shall be permitted to remain on the premises above grade susceptible to becoming airborne.

<u>Utility Notification</u>: Before a building or structure can be wrecked, the owner, wrecking company or person shall notify all utilities having service connections within the building such as water, electric, gas, sewer and other connections to prevent environmental pollution from waste water, toxic materials susceptible to electrical ignition; etc.

<u>Demolition - Segregation of Materials</u>: Demolition materials shall be segregated according to combustible and noncombustible. The sorting and disposal of debris in on-site special purpose containers making certain the proper precautions are undertaken for the various toxic chemicals, acids, fuel oils, cleaning fluids, paints, and other pollutants, are utilized and disposed of as prescribed by law.

RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR ACM REMOVAL AND DEMOLITION

Permit and Inspection Fees:

- A. Notification submittal:
 - 1. A notification must be submitted and a permit obtained for all asbestos removal projects performed in suburban Cook County, regardless of the amount or type of asbestos containing material to be removed.
 - 2. Single family residences and residential buildings of four rental units or less are exempt from this rule.
 - 3. A demolition permit application must be filed with the department prior to the start of a commercial or residential demolition project in suburban Cook County.
 - 4. Notifications for asbestos removal and demolition projects must be submitted to the department 10 working days prior to the start date of a project.
 - 5. In addition to building information, owner and contractor information, the notice must also contain the start and completion dates of the project.
 - 6. Notice also must contain work shift times.
 - 7. A notification must be fully completed and accompanied with payment of appropriate fees to be considered valid by the department.
 - 8. DEMOLITION AND ASBESTOS FEE STRUCTURE

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Single Family Home - \$100.00; Detached Garage - \$75.00 Commercial or Industrial buildings - \$100.00 per structure

ASBESTOS FILING FEE: \$100.00

Inspection fees: \$3.00 per square foot

\$1.00 per lineal foot

cap of \$1,000.00

- O&M (Operation and Maintenance) are valid for twelve months. A \$100.00 filing fee must accompany the original notification. Payments for the amount of asbestos removed under the O&M are paid on a quarterly basis with a cap of \$1,000.00 per guarter.
- B. Phase Work:
 - 1. If a project is to be performed in phases, the contractor must notify the department on company letterhead of the scheduled start and completion dates of each phase; this must accompany original notification and permit fees.
 - 2. The contractor's letter must acknowledge the contractor's responsibility to comply with the department's policy on notifications.

Dear Sir or Madam:

The State of Illinois has recently passed new legislation requiring a fee of \$150 to be paid to the Illinois EPA with each initial 10-working day notice required to be filed to perform remediation or demolition of asbestos-containing structures as required by the federal asbestos National Emission Standard for Hazardous Air Pollutants. (See 415 ILCS 5/9.13, Illinois Environmental Protection Act) This fee is effective July 1, 2003, and all notices postmarked on or after July 1, 2003, are subject to this fee.

This fee is required for initial 10-working day notification filed with the Illinois EPA and includes regular notices, emergency notices, ordered demolitions, and annual notices. Revised and courtesy notices do not require a fee. The fee must be submitted, along with the notification, by company check, personal check or cashier's check. Cash or credit card will not be accepted. Make checks payable to Illinois EPA and make notation that it is for asbestos fees.

Please note: In the event that the fee payment is from an account with insufficient funds to cover the fee, the 10-working day notice shall be deemed improperly filed, and the owner or operator of the site is subject to enforcement for failure to properly file the initial 10-day notification.

The fee is doubled to \$300.00 if the demolition or renovation of a site has commenced without proper filing of the 10-working day notice. This additional fee does not preclude the Illinois EPA or Attorney General's Office from pursuing enforcement action against the owner or operator for failure to file the 10working day notice or other violations of asbestos NESHAP or the Illinois Environmental Protection Act.

This legislation also prescribes where asbestos remediation or demolition activities have not been conducted in accordance with the asbestos NESHAP, the Agency may, in addition to the fee, collect its actual costs incurred for asbestos-related activities at the site, including sampling, sample analysis, remediation plan review and activity oversight.

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RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR ACM REMOVAL AND DEMOLITION

Permit and Inspection Fees:

- A. Notification submittal:
 - 1. A notification must be submitted and a permit obtained for all asbestos removal projects performed in suburban Cook County, regardless of the amount or type of asbestos containing material to be removed.
 - 2. Single family residences and residential buildings of four rental units or less are exempt from this rule.
 - 3. A demolition permit application must be filed with the department prior to the start of a commercial or residential demolition project in suburban Cook County.
 - 4. Notifications for asbestos removal and demolition projects must be submitted to the department 10 working days prior to the start date of a project.
 - 5. In addition to building information, owner and contractor information, the notice must also contain the start and completion dates of the project.
 - 6. Notice also must contain work shift times.
 - 7. A notification must be fully completed and accompanied with payment of appropriate fees to be considered valid by the department.
 - 8. DEMOLITION AND ASBESTOS FEE STRUCTURE

DEMOLITION:

Single Family Home - \$100.00; Detached Garage - \$75.00 Commercial or Industrial buildings - \$100.00 per structure

ASBESTOS FILING FEE: \$100.00 Inspection fees: \$3.00 per square foot \$1.00 per lineal foot cap of \$1,000.00

- 9. O&M (Operation and Maintenance) are valid for twelve months. A \$100.00 filing fee must accompany the original notification. Payments for the amount of asbestos removed under the O&M are paid on a quarterly basis with a cap of \$1,000.00 per quarter.
- B. Phase Work:
 - 1. If a project is to be performed in phases, the contractor must notify the department on company letterhead of the scheduled start and completion dates of each phase; this must accompany original notification and permit fees.
 - 2. The contractor's letter must acknowledge the contractor's responsibility to comply with the department's policy on notifications.
